The PVAEC State of Maine-approved Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) course includes classroom instruction, skills labs, and clinical experience. Enrollment is limited to 10 students. The admission process requires a criminal background check and reading comprehension testing. Tuition covers textbooks, background checks, and the state exam. Admittance to the course requires proof of all necessary healthcare worker vaccinations, including the full COVID-19 vaccine series. SOLUTION SERVICE SER

This course is designed to teach experienced CNAs how to administer selected injectable medications and non-injectable medications to patients 4 years and older under the on-site supervision of a licensed nurse. Potential students must be currently licensed CNAs, listed as "active" on the Maine CNA Registry, or have employer documentation of the equivalent of at least one year of full-time employment as a certified nursing assistant, provide two letters of recommendation from Registered Nurses, and achieve a qualifying reading score on our placement testing. Payment plans and financial assistance may be available to those who qualify. Phlebotomy

This course is designed to equip students with the essential skills for blood collection and laboratory procedures. Through a combination of classroom instruction and hands-on training, students will learn venipuncture techniques, anatomy, safety protocols, and patient care. Emphasis will be placed on real-world experience with various phlebotomy methods and equipment handling.

By the end of the course, students will be prepared to pursue careers in hospitals, clinics, blood donation centers, and laboratories. Successful participants will be ready to sit for the National Healthcareer Association (NHA) national certification exam.

Students will gain a strong understanding of anatomy and physiology relevant to phlebotomy, master blood collection techniques, develop skills in patient communication and care, and learn infection control and safety protocols. The course will thoroughly prepare students for the NHA National Certification Exam, setting them up for success in the healthcare field. CDL-A

Kickstart your career in the trucking industry with PVAEC's comprehensive CDL-A training program. This course combines classroom instruction and hands-on driving experience, preparing you for the written and skills tests required for a Class A Commercial Driver's License (CDL). A Class A CDL allows you to operate various commercial vehicles, including big rigs and tractor-trailers, and is required for vehicles with a Gross Vehicle Weight of 26,001 pounds or more.

The program includes instruction on vehicle inspections, air brakes, combination vehicles, and extensive behind-the-wheel practice. Students will spend significant time on the range and on the road, gaining the experience necessary to demonstrate safe driving skills. The course is designed to meet State of Maine standards and industry regulations for classroom and driving instruction.

To earn your CDL, students must pass both written tests (general knowledge, air brakes, and combination) and road tests. The course also includes a pre-employment drug test and DOT physical (included with tuition).

The program consists of 147 hours of training, with all materials provided. Students are expected to maintain professional conduct and attire at all times.

Needle Felting with Julie Knowlton

Valentine's Day - I really felt it!

Discover wet felting in this beginner-friendly class! Create an 8x10 piece of colorful felt art by layering fibers and using a wet-felting technique.
